<u>Categorical Exclusion Applied (from Subpart D, 10 C.F.R. Part 1021)</u>: B1.25 Real property transfers for cultural resources protection, habitat preservation, and wildlife management

<u>Description of the Proposed Action</u>: BPA is proposing to fund the Kalispel Tribe of Indians to purchase Big Meadows III property, a 15-acre parcel of land located 25 miles west of Priest River in Bonner County, Idaho. BPA would hold a conservation easement to permanently protect, mitigate, and enhance wildlife and wildlife habitat on the property.

Funding the purchase of the property would serve as partial mitigation of wildlife losses associated with the construction and operation of Albeni Falls Dam and Reservoir, part of the Federal Columbia River Power System. This land purchase would specifically satisfy some of BPA's commitments made in the 2000 "Northern Idaho Wildlife Mitigation Agreement" between the Tribe and BPA, as amended in 2006.

The property would be part of the Big Meadows Wildlife Management Unit previously acquired by the Tribe with BPA funds. It is the last un-developed parcel of land that offers expanded wet meadow and forested wetland habitat contributing flows to Goose Creek (where westslope cutthroat and bull trout habitat is being restored) and will be important in improving elk and deer migration corridors, cover, and forage. The Kalispel Tribe of Indians would develop a management plan to guide the protection and enhancement of habitat and other resources on the property. The management plan would be reviewed by BPA for consistency with the conservation easement and the purpose of the acquisition. If BPA proposes to fund any additional activities on the property, further environmental review may be conducted.

<u>Findings</u>: In accordance with Section 1021.410(b) of the Department of Energy's (DOE) National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Regulations (57 FR 15144, Apr. 24, 1992, as amended at 61 FR 36221-36243, July 9, 1996; 61 FR 64608, Dec. 6, 1996, 76 FR 63764, Nov. 14, 2011), BPA has determined that the proposed action:

- (1) fits within a class of actions listed in Appendix A of 10 CFR 1021, Subpart D (see attached Environmental Checklist;
- (2) does not present any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal; and
- (3) has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion.

Based on these determinations, BPA finds that the proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.

The 15-acre property is comprised of wet meadow, forested wetland, and upland mixed conifer forest habitat along the northern perimeter of Blanc Creek and Goose Creek Floodplain. It lies on the southern edge of Squaw Valley Road. The property has been identified as a rural development parcel for single family residence or recreational use and has been used for forestry and recreational visits in the past. Areas on the west and south have older permanent perimeter fencing.
