Description of the Proposed Action: BPA has received a request from T-Mobile to collocate a new telecommunications facility at BPA's Boistfort Peak Radio Site. The project would include the addition of a new equipment cabinet placed on a new 8-foot by 8-foot concrete platform located at the base of the existing BPA Boistfort telecommunications tower. T-Mobile would attach new 15-inch tall antenna arrays 140 feet up on the 200-foot tall tower. The antennas would be attached to coaxial cable runs protected by an ice bridge that would lead into the new equipment cabinet where the cables would terminate. All work would occur within the existing chain-linked fence on BPA property. Construction staging would take place within an existing rocked parking area. No new access roads or disturbance is proposed to support this project.

<u>Findings</u>: In accordance with Section 1021.410(b) of the Department of Energy's (DOE) National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Regulations (57 FR 15144, Apr. 24, 1992, as amended at 61 FR 36221-36243, July 9, 1996; 61 FR 64608, Dec. 6, 1996, 76 FR 63764, Nov. 14, 2011), BPA has determined that the proposed action:

- (1) fits within a class of actions listed in Appendix B of 10 CFR 1021, Subpart D (see attached Environmental Checklist);
- (2) does not present any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal; and
- (3) has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion.

Based on these determinations, BPA finds that the proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
