<u>Description of the Proposed Action</u>: BPA proposes to provide software upgrades, communications service, and ancillary equipment at its John Day Substation and control centers, to allow AvanGrid to integrate 20 MW of solar power generation into BPA's Balancing Authority Area in Sherman County, Oregon. The proposed point of integration is on BPA's existing Klondike Schoolhouse-John Day No.1, 230 kV transmission line.

All work would take place within existing facilities and the project would not require any new ground disturbance or building modifications.

AvanGrid is developing the solar project adjacent to their existing wind energy facility and have acquired necessary siting permits.

<u>Findings</u>: In accordance with Section 1021.410(b) of the Department of Energy's (DOE) National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Regulations (57 FR 15144, Apr. 24, 1992, as amended at 61 FR 36221-36243, July 9, 1996; 61 FR 64608, Dec. 6, 1996, 76 FR 63764, Nov. 14, 2011), BPA has determined that the proposed action:

- (1) fits within a class of actions listed in Appendix B of 10 CFR 1021, Subpart D (see attached Environmental Checklist);
- (2) does not present any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal; and
- (3) has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion.

Based on these determinations, BPA finds that the proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
