<u>Categorical Exclusion Applied (from Subpart D, 10 C.F.R. Part 1021)</u>: B1.25 Real property transfers for cultural resources protection, habitat preservation, and wildlife management

<u>Description of the Proposed Action</u>: BPA is proposing to fund the Kalispel Tribe of Indians to purchase the Calispell Creek III property, a 40-acre parcel of land located 49 miles northwest of Spokane in Pend Oreille County, Washington. The United States would hold a conservation easement, which BPA would manage, to permanently protect, mitigate, and enhance fish and wildlife and their habitat.

Funding the purchase of the property would serve as partial mitigation for the construction and operation of the Federal Columbia River Power System which includes dams on the main stem Columbia and Snake rivers. This land purchase would specifically satisfy some of BPA's commitments made in the Memorandum of Understanding between the Kalispel Tribe of Indians and the Bonneville Power Administration.

The property consists of wet meadow and wetland habitat. The Kalispel Tribe of Indians would develop a management plan to guide the protection and enhancement of habitat and other resources on the property. The management plan would be reviewed by BPA for consistency with the conservation easement and the purpose of the acquisition. If BPA proposes to fund any additional activities on the property, further environmental review may be conducted.

<u>Findings</u>: In accordance with Section 1021.410(b) of the Department of Energy's (DOE) National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Regulations (57 FR 15144, Apr. 24, 1992, as amended at 61 FR 36221-36243, July 9, 1996; 61 FR 64608, Dec. 6, 1996, 76 FR 63764, Nov. 14, 2011), BPA has determined that the proposed action:

- (1) fits within a class of actions listed in Appendix A of 10 CFR 1021, Subpart D (see attached Environmental Checklist;
- (2) does not present any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal; and
- (3) has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion.

Based on these determinations, BPA finds that the proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.

# **Categorical Exclusion Environmental Checklist**

**Proposed Action:** Calispell Creek III Property Acquisiton Funding

#### **Project Site Description**

The 40-acre Calispell Creek III property lies within the floodplain of the Calispell Creek and the Pend Oreille River. It sits on the southern edge of Squaw Valley Road. The eastern boundary is demarcated by Highway 20, which is fenced, and the southern boundary is also fenced from the adjacent forest lands. Lands to the north and west are used for agricultural purposes and are not fenced. The property is a single parcel in a rural area zoned as natural resource lands. It has been used in the past for hay farming; it has been lightly harvested within the last 20 years and has had minimal pre-development in anticipation of recreational home construction that was never built. The property hosts Canada geese, mallard duck, wild turkey, and elk. There are no waterways or ESA-listed species on the parcel.
