<u>Categorical Exclusion Applied (from Subpart D, 10 C.F.R. Part 1021)</u>: B1.25 Real property transfers for cultural resources protection, habitat preservation, and wildlife management.

<u>Description of the Proposed Action</u>: BPA is proposing to fund McKenzie River Trust to purchase a conservation easement on the Cerro Gordo property, a 532-acre parcel of land located 4 miles east of Cottage Grove in Lane County, OR. BPA would hold a conservation easement to prevent the conversion of fish and wildlife habitat on the property to other land uses. BPA would also provide stewardship funds toward maintenance of the property to the landowner, McKenzie River Trust.

This funding partially fulfills commitments made in the 2010 "Willamette River Basin Memorandum of Agreement regarding Wildlife Habitat Protection and Enhancement between the State of Oregon and the Bonneville Power Administration." This is part of BPA's ongoing efforts to mitigate for the impacts to fish and wildlife of the construction and operation of Federal flood control and power facilities in the Willamette River Basin. Placing this property in a conservation easement would provide long-lasting wildlife benefits as part of a growing network of conservation lands in the Willamette Valley that is preventing the conversion of fish and wildlife habitat to other land uses.

The purpose of the conservation easement is to protect habitat in the Willamette Valley. McKenzie River Trust would develop a management plan to guide the protection and enhancement of habitat and other resources on the property. The management plan would be reviewed by BPA for consistency with the purpose of the Conservation Easement. If BPA proposes to fund any additional activities on the property, further environmental review may be conducted.

Findings: In accordance with Section 1021.410(b) of the Department of Energy's (DOE) National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Regulations (57 FR 15144, Apr. 24, 1992, as amended at 61 FR 36221-36243, July 9, 1996; 61 FR 64608, Dec. 6, 1996, 76 FR 63764, Nov. 14, 2011), BPA has determined that the proposed action:

- (1) fits within a class of actions listed in Appendix B of 10 CFR 1021, Subpart D (see attached Environmental Checklist);
- (2) does not present any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal; and
- (3) has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion.

Based on these determinations, BPA finds that the proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
