<u>Categorical Exclusion Applied (from Subpart D, 10 C.F.R. Part 1021)</u>: B1.25 Real property transfers for cultural resources protection, habitat preservation, and wildlife management

<u>Description of the Proposed Action</u>: BPA is proposing to fund Confederated Tribes of the Grand Ronde to purchase the Chahalpam 3 property, which is a 33-acre parcel of land located 2 miles SW of Stayton in Linn County, OR. BPA would hold a conservation easement to prevent the conversion of fish and wildlife habitat on the property to other land uses. BPA would also provide stewardship funds toward maintenance of the property to the landowner, the Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde.

This funding partially fulfills commitments made in the 2010 "Willamette River Basin Memorandum of Agreement Regarding Wildlife Habitat Protection and Enhancement between the State of Oregon and the Bonneville Power Administration." This is part of BPA's ongoing efforts to mitigate for the impacts to fish and wildlife of the construction and operation of Federal flood control facilities in the Willamette River Basin.

This is an opportunity to expand the conservation protection of the Chahalpam Wildlife Area to include both banks of the North Santiam River. The proposed acquisition consists of intact riparian hardwood forest which is highly connected with the North Santiam River floodplain with numerous backwater and off-channel habitats. Additionally, this is an excellent example of dual benefits to listed and non-listed fish and wildlife species, including, but not limited to Oregon chub, winter steelhead, spring Chinook, Pacific lamprey, western pond turtle, pileated woodpecker, little willow flycatcher, kestrel, black tail deer, and beaver.

The Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde would develop a management plan to guide the protection and enhancement of habitat and other resources on the property. The management plan would be reviewed by BPA for consistency with the conservation easement and the purpose of the acquisition. If BPA proposes to fund any additional activities on the property, further environmental review may be conducted.

<u>Findings</u>: In accordance with Section 1021.410(b) of the Department of Energy's (DOE) National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Regulations (57 FR 15144, Apr. 24, 1992, as amended at 61 FR 36221-36243, July 9, 1996; 61 FR 64608, Dec. 6, 1996, 76 FR 63764, Nov. 14, 2011), BPA has determined that the proposed action:

- (1) fits within a class of actions listed in Appendix A of 10 CFR 1021, Subpart D (see attached Environmental Checklist;
- (2) does not present any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal; and
- (3) has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion.

Based on these determinations, BPA finds that the proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.


Landowner Notification, Involvement, or Coordination




