Description:

Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy is proposing to provide funding to Case Western Reserve University in support of a research and development project that would develop a hybrid mechanical-chemical recycling technology for multilayered and laminated plastics. The goal of the proposed project is to separate and upcycle up to more than 80% of the two main constituents of such structures, polyolefins and polyesters, for a significantly lower cost and at higher energetic efficiency and much larger throughputs than chemical recycling.

The project would be completed over the course of four Budget Periods. Project activities would include technology benchmarking, computational modeling, equipment development and scale up, and demonstration of materials separation via extrusion at research and development scale. Work would be completed in laboratory facilities at Case Western Reserve University, at Braskem America Innovation & Technology Center, Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory, and Sandia National Laboratories.

The project would involve the manipulation of potentially hazardous chemicals. Existing health and safety policies and procedures will be followed, including employee training, proper protective equipment and internal assessments. Additional policies and procedures will be implemented as necessary as new health and safety risks are identified.

All facilities in which project work would be conducted were purpose-built for the type of activities being proposed; therefore, no adverse impacts to sensitive resources are expected as a result of the proposed activities at any location. No change in the use, mission or operation of existing facilities would arise out of this effort. Any work proposed to be conducted at a federal facility may be subject to additional NEPA review by the cognizant federal official and must meet the applicable health and safety requirements of the facility.
