# Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide federal funding to the National Association of State Energy Officials (NASEO) to conduct education and outreach activities in support of the research, development, and deployment goals of DOE's Building Technologies Office (BTO) and State Energy Offices (SEOs). NASEO would facilitate peer learning among SEOs, assess state needs, assist DOE in engaging states, enhance relevant DOE tools, activities, and resources for the benefit of BTO stakeholders and the general public, and support the integration of advanced technologies and processes that improve energy efficiency and resilience in the building sector. Project activities would include facilitating the outreach and exchange of information among DOE, SEOs, key stakeholders, and private sector organizations across building energy technologies and other energy sectors relevant to BTO's work. Project work would be completed over a single Budget Period. All project activities would consist exclusively of intellectual, academic, or analytical activities such as information gathering, data analysis, and data dissemination.

There are no extraordinary circumstances related to the proposed action that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal.

The proposed action has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion. This proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.25(a)(1)), is not related to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.27(b)(7)), and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or 10 CFR 1021.211 concerning limitations on actions during preparation of an environmental impact statement.

The proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
