Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide funding to ReSource Chemical Corp. to develop technology to produce furan-2,5-dicarboxylic acid (FDCA), a sustainably sourced replacement for conventional petrochemicals used to make plastic for food packages, bottles, films, and fibers. The process would utilize carbon dioxide (CO2) to convert furfural (derived from inedible biomass feedstocks) to FDCA. The project would be completed over two Budget Periods (BPs) with a Go/No-Go decision point between each BP. This NEPA review is applicable to both BPs.

Project activities would include lab experiments, optimizing the CO2 capture process and CO2 utilization, the formation of polymer-grade FDCA, and drafting the design of a demonstration plant which would include the predicted budget and schedule for construction and operation. ReSource Chemical Corp., using lab space at Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory in Berkeley, CA, would perform chemical reactions, preparation of chemical substrates and reagents in the form of solids and solutions, and analysis of chemical purity and reaction outcomes using liquid chromatography. Work would occur in purpose built lab facilities. No changes in the use, mission, or operation of existing facilities would be required as part of this project and no additional permits would be required in order to conduct any of the work activities.

Project activities would include the use and handling of various hazardous materials (including acids, bases, CO2 gas, and organic solvents) and performing chemical reactions at elevated temperature and pressure. Any risks associated with the handling of these materials would be mitigated through adherence to established health and safety policies and procedures. Protocols would include employee training, the use of personal protective equipment, monitoring, engineering controls, and internal assessments. Hazardous chemicals would be transported from vendors in totes using licensed professional transport service providers. All waste products would be disposed of by licensed waste management service providers. Resource Chemical Corp. would observe all applicable Federal, state, and local health, safety, and environmental regulations.

Any work proposed to be conducted at a federal facility may be subject to additional NEPA review by the cognizant federal official and must meet the applicable health and safety requirements of the facility.

DOE has made a final NEPA determination.

This proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.25(a)(1)), is not related to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.27(b)(7)), and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or 10 CFR 1021.211 concerning limitations on actions during preparation of an environmental impact statement.

The proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
