Description:

A9 Information gathering,

Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information analysis, and dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and dissemination informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. B3.6 Smallscale **laboratory** operations, and pilot projects

Siting, construction, modification, operation, and decommissioning of facilities for smallscale research and development projects; conventional laboratory operations (such as preparation of chemical standards and research and sample analysis); and small-scale pilot projects (generally less than 2 years) frequently conducted to verify a development, concept before demonstration actions, provided that construction or modification would be within or contiguous to a previously disturbed or developed area (where active utilities and currently used roads are readily accessible). Not included in this category are demonstration actions, meaning actions that are undertaken at a scale to show whether a technology would be viable on a larger scale and suitable for commercial deployment.

Small-scale renewable energy research and development projects and small-scale pilot projects, provided that the projects are located within a previously disturbed or developed area. Covered actions would be in research and accordance with applicable requirements (such as local land use and zoning requirements) in the proposed **development** project area and would incorporate appropriate control technologies and best management practices.

Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide funding to StorEdgeAl to develop and test a novel solar-powered non-wire energy carrier. The device would be designed to store energy produced by solar photovoltaic (PV) systems. Prototype versions of the energy carrier device would be developed and tested in laboratory settings and outdoors at a dedicated solar farm. The project would be completed over two Budget Periods (BPs), with a Go/No-Go Decision Point in between each BP.

A previous NEPA Determination (GFO-0009331-001; CXs A9, B3.6, B5.15; 12/23/2020) reviewed all project activities. Since that time:

- The awardee has proposed that some of the testing activities originally planned to be conducted at Marquette University would be conducted instead at the Bordentown, NJ solar farm owned and operated by NWL. There are no changes to the scope of work or the type of testing being conducted. This purpose-built location was previously reviewed in the original NEPA Determination and no new environmental impacts have been identified that would result from implementation of additional testing activities at NWL.
- · A new location (the University of Washington Clean Energy Testbed facility in Seattle, WA) has been proposed for

certain project activities. Limited work would happen at this facility, mostly storage and assembly of equipment, and initial laboratory-scale testing to check the assembled prototype unit is functioning. No change in the use, mission, or operation of this existing facility would arise out of project efforts. The facility has all applicable permits in place, and would not need additional permits for the proposed activities.

Upon review of the proposed location changes, DOE has determined that project activities would still fall within the category of actions covered by the CXs that were previously applied to this award.

The proposed action (or the part of the proposal defined in the Rationale above) fits within a class of actions that is listed in Appendix A or B to 10 CFR Part 1021, Subpart D. There are no extraordinary circumstances related to the proposed action that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal.

The proposed action has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion. This proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.25(a)(1)), is not related to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.27(b)(7)), and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or 10 CFR 1021.211 concerning limitations on actions during preparation of an environmental impact statement.

The proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
