<u>Proposed Action Title</u>: RedoxBlox, Inc. -- Scaleable Thermochemical Option for Renewable Energy Storage (STORES)

Program or Field Office: Advanced Research Projects Agency - Energy

Location(s) (City/County/State): East Lansing, MI; Charlotte, NC

Proposed Action Description:

Funding will support the project team's research and development activities to develop, integrate, and test a pilot plant comprising a 2MWh (thermal) thermochemical energy storage module and low-cost magnesium-manganese oxide redox material integrated with a 200 kW (electrical) microturbine generator. Specifically, the project team will (1) acquire and qualify magnesium-manganese oxide material; (2) test and validate 10 kWh and 100kWh thermochemical modules; (3) develop comprehensive design for thermal energy storage unit; and (4) complete site preparation, installation, and plant operation for prototype gas turbine generator, thermal storage module and integrated system. If successful, the project team will develop and test a low-cost, long-duration stationary electricity storage solution that will enhance grid resiliency, provide low-cost energy capacity, support grid infrastructure, and enable a greater share of intermittent renewable power generation resources.

Project activities will be conducted at existing facilities at RedoxBlox, Inc. (East Lansing, MI), Michigan State University (East Lansing, MI), and Siemens Energy (Charlotte, NC) designed for the applicable activities. Project tasks will be conducted in accordance with established safety and materials/waste management protocols and pursuant to applicable Federal, State, and local regulatory requirements. No modifications will be made to existing facilities to accommodate the proposed work. Prime Recipient, RedoxBlox, Inc., has not obtained all necessary permits and approvals applicable to proposed actions and is prohibited from commencing applicable project work before (1) obtaining the necessary permits and approvals and (2) providing written assurances to ARPA-E of the same

There are no extraordinary circumstances related to the proposal that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal.

The proposal has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion. This proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.25(a)(1)), is not related to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.27(b)(7)), and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or 10 CFR 1021.211 concerning limitations on actions during preparation of an environmental impact statement.
