Based on my review of the information concerning the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (authorized under DOE Policy 451.1), I have made the following determination:

Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and dissemination informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide funding to Washington State University (WSU) to develop and disseminate an educational program focused on the construction of energy efficient residential buildings. The program would be incorporated into WSU's curriculum and participants would receive accredited degrees/certifications upon completion of the program

Proposed project activities would consist of curriculum development, student enrollment, stakeholder engagement, program dissemination, and surveying/data collection. Instruction would be provided both virtually and in classroom settings.

All project activities would be coordinated by WSU. WSU would develop the curriculum, engage with institutional stakeholders, and impart classroom and virtual training. Pacific Northwest National Laboratory (PNNL) would assist with the development of the training program and may also provide training modules. All work activities would be performed at existing office and classroom locations. No physical modifications to existing facilities, ground disturbance, or changes to the use, mission, or operation of existing facilities would be required. No additional permits or authorizations would be required.

Because project activities are limited to office and classroom-based work, no significant health and safety hazards are anticipated. Nonetheless, WSU and PNNL would observe all applicable Federal, state, and local health, safety, and environmental regulations

Any work proposed to be conducted at a federal facility may be subject to additional NEPA review by the cognizant federal official and must meet the applicable health and safety requirements of the facility.
