Description:

Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and dissemination informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide funding to the New Mexico Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department (EMNRD) to expand building energy code training opportunities at higher education institutes (HEIs) throughout New Mexico. Four higher education institutes (HEIs) would implement the creation and development of curriculum modules that incorporate building energy codes into existing and new in-person and virtual college courses and would develop new professional credentials, with provisions for Continuing Education Units (CEUs) or Continuing Education Credits (CECs), Certificates of Achievement, and/or Certificates of Completion related to building energy code training.

Proposed project activities would include development of online training tools and classroom-based curriculums, stakeholder engagement, and development and implementation of the training program. The EMNRD would coordinate all project activities and lead administrative functions associated with the project. The HEIs would develop and implement the training curriculum. No physical modifications to existing facilities, ground disturbance, or changes to the use, mission, or operation of existing facilities would be required.

The proposed project would consist solely of intellectual, academic, and/or analytical activities. All project activities would be conducted from existing offices or computational facilities and use no materials beyond basic office supplies, software, and computer hardware.
