Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide federal funding to Frontier Energy, Inc. to develop and disseminate curriculum on the proper installation and maintenance of HVAC systems for inclusion in continuing education programs and contractor technical courses through a pilot program. The curriculum would be distributed through training programs with the California Community College (CCC) network in the Inland Empire region of California. Materials would be updated based on evaluation from the pilot phase, and revisions would be disseminated through the CCC network and industry HVAC training programs. A dedicated project website would be built and used to host project activities and results. Project work would be completed over three Budget Periods (BPs) with Go/No-Go decision points between each BP. All project activities would consist exclusively of intellectual, academic, or analytical activities such as information gathering, data analysis, and data dissemination. No modifications to facilities, field testing, or field work would occur as part of the DOE funded project.
