Based on my review of the information concerning the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (authorized under DOE Policy 451.1), I have made the following determination:

Description:

A9 Information gathering, analysis, and dissemination Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide funding to the International Center for Appropriate and Sustainable Technology (ICAST) in Denver, CO to develop educational resources aimed at target stakeholder groups to develop necessary training relating to HVAC technologies, including creating and testing a new curriculum in partnership with Santa Fe Community College (SFCC). The project would be completed over two Budget Periods (BPs) with a Go/No-Go decision point between each BP. This NEPA determination is applicable to both BPs.

The core scope of the work would be to develop a project team including an advisory board of stakeholders, creating training courses and materials, and testing them on several cohorts of trainees. In BP1, this would include drafting an initial pilot curriculum and educational modules for both online classroom study and an on-the-job-training (OJT) program. Potential trainees would be recruited, including established professionals with experience and entry-level members of the community who would like to pursue a career in the HVAC industry. The contractor network of ICAST would be utilized to recruit trainees. Multi-family housing and commercial building projects already planning installation of cold-climate air source heat pumps (ccASHP) independent of the DOE funded project would be identified for OJT partnerships and project sites. Finally, feedback would be collected from stakeholders and trainees to inform the curriculum and to develop a pilot curriculum for a larger number of trainees in BP2.

BP2 would consist of the continuation of trainee recruitment and procurement of OJT sites, as well as progress analysis. All trainees would be surveyed post training to gather information about changes in their wages and opportunities, in order to assess how the project is serving its target demographic. Outreach through marketing and personal connections would ensure that a pipeline of small commercial buildings and multi-family housing units already planning ccASHP installation projects would be available for OJT. Finally, enhancements would be made to the curriculum based on feedback, and the program would be disseminated nationwide once a creative commons license would be received.

Reports and other deliverables would be provided in accordance with the Federal Assistance Reporting Checklist. There are no health or safety hazards expected due to the work that would be performed as part of the DOE funded project. There would be no modification of facilities, ground disturbing activities, or change in use or installation of equipment outdoors.
