Based on my review of the information concerning the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (authorized under DOE Policy 451.1), I have made the following determination:

Description:

A9 Information gathering, analysis, and dissemination Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. B3.6 Smallscale research and development, laboratory operations, and pilot projects Siting, construction, modification, operation, and decommissioning of facilities for smallscale research and development projects; conventional laboratory operations (such as preparation of chemical standards and sample analysis); and small-scale pilot projects (generally less than 2 years) frequently conducted to verify a concept before demonstration actions, provided that construction or modification would be within or contiguous to a previously disturbed or developed area (where active utilities and currently used roads are readily accessible). Not included in this category are demonstration actions, meaning actions that are undertaken at a scale to show whether a technology would be viable on a larger scale and suitable for commercial deployment.

# Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide federal funding to Montana State University (MSU) to investigate a process to precipitate minerals to reduce permeability and control short circuiting in Enhanced Geothermal Systems (EGSs). The project would combine experimental laboratory work (mineral precipitation, analysis, evaluation, etc.) with computational reservoir scale modeling using Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory's (LBNL) TOUGHREACT simulator. This simulator would be used to assess reaction rates, injection strategies, fracture features such as surface roughness, fluid viscosity enhancements, and to conduct simulated field tests. Project work would occur at MSU in Bozeman, MT and LBNL in Berkeley, CA. Any work proposed to be conducted at a federal facility may be subject to additional NEPA review by the cognizant federal official and must meet the applicable health and safety requirements of the facility.

Project activities would occur within existing laboratories designed for this type of work that would utilize standard laboratory equipment; therefore, no modifications, new permits, additional licenses and/or authorizations would be necessary. No ground disturbing activities, no changes in the operation of existing facilities, and no installation of equipment outdoors would occur for project activities. Experiments would be conducted at elevated temperatures so standard laboratory precautions would be followed. Project work would occur within facilities with dedicated proper health and safety policies and procedures. All waste would be disposed of in accordance with existing health and safety standards as well as applicable regulations. DOE does not anticipate any impacts to resources of concern due to the proposed activities of the project.
