B5.17 Solar thermal The installation, modification, operation, and removal of commercially available smallscale solar thermal systems (including, but not limited to, solar hot water systems) located on or contiguous to a building, and if located on land, generally comprising less than 10 acres within a previously disturbed or developed area. Covered actions would be in accordance with applicable requirements (such as local land use and zoning requirements) in the proposed project area and would incorporate appropriate control technologies and best management practices.

Rationale for determination:

The Tonto Apache Tribe (TAT) would utilize DOE and cost share funds to install commercially available solar thermal and solar photovoltaics (PV) at four of the tribe's facilities. Under this project, the installed solar systems would be a mixture of roof mount, ground mount, and solar shade structure arrays on and around the four tribal buildings. The project would be located on the Tonto Apache Reservation in Payson, AZ at the Community Center, the Tonto Market, the Water Treatment Facility, and the Water Tower. Project tasks include design work, engineering, construction, interconnection, and reporting. This project is an expansion of previous work completed under a different award that received a separate NEPA Determination (GFO-0006477-001) on 01/02/2014 for solar PV installations at buildings adjacent to the ones proposed for this project.

Modules planned for the Community Center would be a combination of roof mounted and parking canopy mounted solar thermal. Both the Water Treatment Facility and the Water Tower would have ground mounted solar PV systems installed and the Tonto Market would have a combination of roof and ground mounted solar PV installed. All project activities would occur within existing disturbance or on the roofs of existing buildings. Reservation land was given to the Tribe in 1972 and the buildings involved in this project were built after that time. All four of the facilities are located next to the highly trafficked multi-story Mazatzal Hotel and Casino. Due to the existing disturbance and the highly trafficked nature of the project area, DOE has determined that neither biological nor cultural/historic resources would be affected by project activities. There were no other resources of concern found during review of the proposed project activities.

Based on review of the project information, DOE has determined that the project activities would not have a significant individual or cumulative impact to human health and/or environment. DOE has determined that these activities are consistent with actions contained in DOE categorical exclusions A9 "Information gathering, analysis, and dissemination," B5.16 "Solar photovoltaic systems," and B5.17 "Solar thermal systems," and are categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
