Based on my review of the information concerning the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (authorized under DOE Order 451.1A), I have made the following determination:

Description:

A9 Information gathering,

Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and analysis, and information dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and dissemination classroom training and informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. (See also B3.1 of appendix B to this subpart.)

B1.31 machinery and equipment

Installation or relocation and operation of machinery and equipment (including, but not limited to, laboratory Installation or equipment, electronic hardware, manufacturing machinery, maintenance equipment, and health and safety relocation of equipment), provided that uses of the installed or relocated items are consistent with the general missions of the receiving structure. Covered actions include modifications to an existing building, within or contiguous to a previously disturbed or developed area, that are necessary for equipment installation and relocation. Such modifications would not appreciably increase the footprint or height of the existing building or have the potential to cause significant changes to the type and magnitude of environmental impacts.

B3.6 Smallscale laboratory operations, and pilot projects

Siting, construction, modification, operation, and decommissioning of facilities for smallscale research and development projects; conventional laboratory operations (such as preparation of chemical standards and research and sample analysis); and small-scale pilot projects (generally less than 2 years) frequently conducted to verify development, a concept before demonstration actions, provided that construction or modification would be within or contiguous to a previously disturbed or developed area (where active utilities and currently used roads are readily accessible). Not included in this category are demonstration actions, meaning actions that are undertaken at a scale to show whether a technology would be viable on a larger scale and suitable for commercial deployment.

## Rationale for determination:

United Technologies Research Center (UTRC) would utilize DOE and cost share funding to demonstrate a solid state (refrigerant-free), high efficiency, compact, zero direct global warming heat pump with the potential to replace refrigerantbased vapor compression systems. Project work would take place at UTRC's dedicated research center laboratory facility in Hartford, Connecticut. The heat pump module technology would be advanced from a TRL of 2 to 4.

All of the proposed activities would occur within an existing facility designed for this type of laboratory testing. Minor changes to the laboratory facility may be required to set up bench scale material test rigs. These modifications would not require ground disturbing activities or change the mission of the existing facility. Standard UTRC risk Environmental Health and Safety assessments would be conducted on new set ups and safety procedures would be established prior to testing. Current lab and equipment procedures would be following for current labs and test rigs. These procedures include use of personal protective equipment, operating procedures, engineering controls, and employee training. Only authorized, trained and qualified personnel would be used to handle high voltage equipment and solvents. All project activities would be consistent with existing permits.

Based on review of the project information and the above analysis, DOE has determined the proposed project would not have a significant individual or cumulative impact to human health and/or environment. DOE has determined the proposed activities are consistent with actions contained in DOE categorical exclusions A9 "Information gathering, analysis, and dissemination," B1.31 "Installation or relocation of machinery and equipment," and B3.6 "Small-scale research and

development, laboratory operations, and pilot projects," and are categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
