Description:

DOE/EA 1914 Final Site-Wide Environmental Assessment of the Department of Energy's National Wind Technology (NREL NWTC) Center at the National Renewable Energy Laboratory

Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing a site improvement project at the National Wind Technology Center (NWTC) to remove certain materials related to wind turbine testing that are currently stored in a series of outdoor storage yards located north of buildings 254, 256, and 257. The work would begin in mid-February 2016 and last less than a month. These materials are considered by NREL Property to be either surplus material, expended material, unsafe to use, or past the useful life. Therefore, these materials would be surplused, recycled or otherwise properly disposed as solid waste. Materials consist of turbine blade components, turbine base pieces, motors, electronic components, transformers, several steel shipping containers filled with shelving and miscellaneous surplus hardware, an antenna structure, concrete pieces, and metal racks.

The onsite work (i.e., demolition and loading) would occur exclusively outdoors in previously disturbed areas. All recycling efforts would occur offsite. No work with hazardous materials is expected. All fluids were previously removed from excess property and disposed of in accordance with state and federal requirements. Once cleared of material, the storage area will be treated for weeds. The area is expected to remain a storage yard, so no further reclamation is planned.

Based on the Department of Energy's NWTC Final Site-Wide Environmental Assessment (DOE/EA-1914) and related field studies and agency consultations, no cultural resources, threatened or endangered species, wetlands, floodplains, or prime farmlands would be impacted by this proposed project. If any construction or construction-related activities (i.e., surveying, off-road vehicle traffic, trenching, etc.) occurs between March 15 and September 1, a survey for ground-nesting birds would be completed prior to project commencement. NREL and all contractors would follow all federal and state regulations, and all NREL Environment, Health, and Safety Policies, Procedures and Programs.

The NWTC Turbine Blade Demolition & Disposal Project is consistent with the activities that are analyzed in the Department of Energy's NWTC Final Site-Wide Environmental Assessment (DOE-EA-1914). Specifically, this type of project is discussed in the Proposed Action Section 2.1.1.4 which describes routine activities for new or modified buildings and infrastructure including "routine tasks for site maintenance". DOE-EA 1914 and the associated Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) are hereby incorporated by reference. DOE has determined that the proposed activities are bounded by the environmental impact analysis contained in DOE-EA 1914, and FONSI, and no further NEPA review is required.
