Based on my review of the information concerning the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (authorized under DOE Order 451.1A), I have made the following determination:

Description:

A9 Information gathering,

Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information analysis, and dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training dissemination and informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. B3.6 Smallscale laboratory operations, and pilot projects

Siting, construction, modification, operation, and decommissioning of facilities for smallscale research and development projects; conventional laboratory operations (such as preparation of chemical standards and research and sample analysis); and small-scale pilot projects (generally less than 2 years) frequently conducted to verify a development, concept before demonstration actions, provided that construction or modification would be within or contiguous to a previously disturbed or developed area (where active utilities and currently used roads are readily accessible). Not included in this category are demonstration actions, meaning actions that are undertaken at a scale to show whether a technology would be viable on a larger scale and suitable for commercial deployment.

## Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide federal funding to Texas State University (TSU) to develop a new metrology to measure, analyze, and optimize the output voltages of solar photovoltaic (PV) cells and modules.

Proposed activities would include design, baseline establishment, development of mathematical methods and formulations, fabrication, data measurement and analysis, optimization of PV cells and modules. Design, baseline establishment and development of mathematical methods and procedures would be completed by TSU on campus in San Marcos, TX. Fabrication would be completed in indoor labs at the University of Toledo (UT) in Toledo, OH and the National Renewable Energy Lab (NREL) in Golden, CO. Data measurement and analysis would be conducted by TSU on campus in San Marcos, TX to optimize mathematical methods and procedures and would then be delivered to UT and NREL for optimization of fabrication conditions. The facilities in which lab work would occur are purposebuilt for the types of activities being proposed; therefore, no adverse impacts to sensitive resources are expected as a result of the proposed project. No change in the use, mission or operation of existing facilities would arise out of this effort. The facilities have all applicable permits in place, and would not need additional permits for the proposed activities.

The proposed project would require working with small amounts of cadmium and tellurium which are toxic materials as well as flammable solvents. Lab workers would be experienced in proper use and disposal to prevent environmental and health risks and follow university hazardous waste procedures. A variety of personal protective equipment would be used to prevent skin contact, inhalation, or ingestion of hazardous materials. Any work proposed to be conducted at a DOE laboratory may be subject to additional NEPA review by the cognizant DOE NEPA Compliance Officer for the specific DOE laboratory prior to initiating such work. Further, any work conducted at a DOE laboratory must meet the laboratory's health and safety requirements.

Based on review of the project information and the above analysis, DOE has determined the proposed project would not have a significant individual or cumulative impact to human health and/or environment. DOE has determined that this project is consistent with actions outlined in DOE categorical exclusions A9 "Information gathering, analysis, and dissemination" and B3.6 "Small-scale research and development, laboratory operations, and pilot projects" and is therefore categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
