Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide funding to the Upper Coastal Plain Council of Government (UCPCOG) to facilitate a mapping system for data-driven energy-efficiency analysis and decision-making to foster collaborations between multiple government and non-governmental entities.

The proposed project would create an enterprise geospatial database of existing federal, state, utility and local energy-efficiency programs in the service area of a rural electric cooperative utility and city-owned utility. The geospatial database would be integrated with a utility energy monitoring software to track the energy savings from participating homes in the program with an emphasis on aiding low-income households. The proposed project would increase organizational collaboration, support better decision-making, and increase energy efficiency in low-income households. The UCPCOG, located in Wilson, ND, would coordinate participant activities.

The participants include:

- -NC State University- NC Clean Energy Technology Center, Center for Geospatial Analysis and System Design and Optimization;
- -NC Sustainable Energy Association;
- -NC Justice Center; Teracell Energy;
- -University of South Carolina, Department of Geography, Environment& Sustainability; and
- -Vermont Law School, Institute for the Energy & the Environment.

The proposed activities would be limited exclusively to intellectual, academic, or analytical activities and would include the research and development of a software tool to analyze energy usage geospatially. Project participants would use no physical materials beyond basic office supplies and software.

Based on the review of the proposal, DOE has determined that the proposal fits within the class of action(s) selected above. DOE has also determined that: (1) there are no extraordinary circumstances (as defined by 10 CFR 1021.410(2)) related to the proposal that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal; (2) the proposal has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion; and (3) the proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts, related to other proposals with cumulatively significant actions, or an improper interim action. This proposal is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
