Based on my review of the information concerning the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (authorized under DOE Order 451.1A), I have made the following determination:

B5.16 Solar photovoltaic systems	The installation, modification, operation, and removal of commercially available solar photovoltaic systems located on a building or other structure (such as rooftop, parking lot or facility, and mounted to signage, lighting, gates, or fences), or if located on land, generally comprising less than 10 acres within a previously disturbed or developed area. Covered actions would be in accordance with applicable requirements (such as local land use and zoning requirements) in the proposed project area and would incorporate appropriate control technologies and best management practices.

Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide funding to the Ute Mountain Ute Tribe (UMUT) for the installation of a 1 MW community-scale fixed axis ground-mounted solar photovoltaic (PV) facility on approximately 4.5 acres of tribally owned land in Towaoc, Colorado. Analyses of the solar array's performance, operation and maintenance, impact of crediting structures, and impact on UMUT's goal to reduce and stabilize energy costs on the reservation would also be performed.

The site selected for the array installation is currently part of a 49.8 acre center-pivot irrigated agricultural field located within the Economic Development District that would be repurposed for use by the solar array and other potential future alternative uses. This DOE project would involve the installation of the solar array as well as transmission equipment. Interconnection to an existing substation, located approximately 500 feet to the west-southwest, would be underground by trenching. Ground disturbing activities include: leveling of the array location, excavation for concrete pad installation, and trenching for underground wires and interconnect. Access roads already exist but may need to be modified and improved for heavy equipment access. Total ground disturbance is expected to be less than five acres and would occur within previously disturbed areas (e.g. actively managed agricultural land and existing roads).

Project activities would not affect wetlands or floodplains. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service lists 10 special status species and 26 migratory bird species as possibly occurring within the project area. While the project area is near habitat that could support special status species, project work is not in nor would it disturb that habitat. With the lack of disturbance to special status species habitat, nature of the project (solar photovoltaic), and the previously disturbed nature of the site; the DOE has determined that there would be no effects to either special status species or migratory birds as a result of the project activities.

There are no National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) listed properties located within two miles of the proposed solar array and transmission equipment which would be installed in a previously disturbed agricultural area and existing roads. UMUT is working directly with their Tribal Historic Preservation Officer (THPO) to ensure protection of cultural resources which would include archaeological monitors being onsite during surface disturbing activities, if determined necessary by the THPO. Although no historic resources are known to occur at the project site, DOE requires the following as part of best management practices for any project with ground disturbing activities: If during project activities the recipient or their staff encounters any cultural material (i.e. historic or prehistoric), all activities must cease in the vicinity of the discovery immediately. The recipient must inform the THPO and the DOE Project Officer of the discovery so that an evaluation of the discovery can be completed prior to continuing work. There were

no other resources of concern found during review of the proposed project.

Based on the review of the proposal, DOE has determined the proposal fits within the class of action(s) and the integral elements of Appendix B to Subpart D of 10 CFR 1021 outlined in the DOE categorical exclusion(s) selected above. DOE has also determined that: (1) there are no extraordinary circumstances (as defined by 10 CFR 1021.410 (2)) related to the proposal that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal; (2) the proposal has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion; and (3) the proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts, related to other proposals with cumulatively significant actions, or an improper interim action. This proposal is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
