Description:

A9 Information gathering,

Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information analysis, and dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and dissemination informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. B3.6 Smallscale **laboratory** operations, and pilot projects

Siting, construction, modification, operation, and decommissioning of facilities for smallscale research and development projects; conventional laboratory operations (such as preparation of chemical standards and research and sample analysis); and small-scale pilot projects (generally less than 2 years) frequently conducted to verify a development, concept before demonstration actions, provided that construction or modification would be within or contiguous to a previously disturbed or developed area (where active utilities and currently used roads are readily accessible). Not included in this category are demonstration actions, meaning actions that are undertaken at a scale to show whether a technology would be viable on a larger scale and suitable for commercial deployment.

Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide funding to Washington State University (WSU) to investigate the doping efficiency of Cadmium telluride (CdTe) and Cadmium selenotelluride (CdSeTe), as potential absorber materials for thin film photovoltaic (PV) application. Thin films would be fabricated, incorporating the targeted dopants into the films. All project work would be completed in a single Budget Period (BP).

Proposed project activities would include CdTe and CdSeTe crystal growth, n-type doping of crystals, thin film fabrication, post deposition treatment, demonstration of Co-doping in n-type CdTe and CdSeTe, and characterization of co-doped films. All project activities would be completed by WSU at existing, purpose-built laboratory facilities at its primary campus in Pullman, WA. No change in the use, mission or operation of existing university facilities would be required. No additional permits or authorizations would be needed to conduct project activities.

The project would involve the use of chemicals, including cadmium and terrium. Risks associated with the handling of these materials would be mitigated through adherence to established health and safety policies and procedures. Protocols would include the use of personal protective equipment, personnel training, monitoring and internal assessments. WSU's Environmental Health and Safety Department (EHS) would provide oversight and facilitate proper disposal of waste materials. WSU would observe all applicable Federal, State and local health, safety and environmental regulations.
