Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide funding to the Philadelphia Energy Authority (PEA) to develop and pilot a solar energy training program. The program would focus on training students enrolled in School District of Philadelphia's (SDP) Career and Technical Education (CTE) Program and the YouthBuild Philly (YBP) Program for entry level jobs in the solar industry. A curriculum would be developed and training would be provided to students that would include classroom education, hands-on training, and paid work experience.

The project would be divided into three Budget Periods (BPs), with a Go/No-Go Decision Point in between each BP. BP1 activities would focus on engaging with relevant stakeholders and initiating the administrative, financial, and program management tasks necessary to establish and initiate the solar energy training program in BP2. In BP1, training cohorts would be formed to pilot the solar energy training program. PEA would deliver approximately 100 hours of training to a cohort of SDP students in the summer as well as 100 hours of training to a cohort of SDP students in the 2019/20 academic year. These pilot programs would be held at existing classroom and lab space facilities at the Knight Training Center of the Energy Coordinating Agency in Philadelphia, PA.

A classroom training facility would be selected during BP1 as part of Subtask 3.7. This facility would be modified to incorporate training equipment for classroom and laboratory spaces as appropriate. Because all previous subtasks are necessary to initiate Subtask 3.7, as information would be gathered that would inform site selection and the development of the solar energy training program, BP1 Subtasks 1.1 – 3.6 are being reviewed as part of this NEPA Determination. BP1 Subtasks 3.8 – 3.9 would also be reviewed, as they would largely take place concurrently with the identification of the training facility site, but work on these two tasks, which would consist of promoting the upcoming training program and identifying candidate students for participation, would need to be initiated prior to site selection and facilities modifications. However, because the site where the training facility would be established is currently unknown, BP1 Subtasks 3.7, 3.10, all BP2 activities and all BP3 activities are restricted until further NEPA review is completed. Additional NEPA review will be completed once all relevant information has been provided by the Recipient.
