Description:

A9 Information gathering,

Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information analysis, and dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and dissemination informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. B3.6 Smallscale research and **laboratory** operations, and pilot projects

Siting, construction, modification, operation, and decommissioning of facilities for smallscale research and development projects; conventional laboratory operations (such as preparation of chemical standards and sample analysis); and small-scale pilot projects (generally less than 2 years) frequently conducted to verify a development, concept before demonstration actions, provided that construction or modification would be within or contiguous to a previously disturbed or developed area (where active utilities and currently used roads are readily accessible). Not included in this category are demonstration actions, meaning actions that are undertaken at a scale to show whether a technology would be viable on a larger scale and suitable for commercial deployment.

Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide federal funding to the Gas Technology Institute (GTI) to develop a highly efficient, grid independent, self-powered, fuel flexible, and drop-in capable integrated Advanced Burner Thermoelectric Generator (ABTEG) system for residential and commercial buildings. The subsystem testing of the advanced burner would occur at GTI's facility in Des Plaines, IL and the subsystem design evaluation of the Thermoelectric Generator (TEG) would occur at Sheetak, Inc. in Austin, TX. The integrated ABTEG system would be tested at GTI.

The project includes activities for the design, development, integration and laboratory testing of a 3D printed advanced burner with a TEG on a commercial water heater unit. A Market Transformation Plan would also be developed. All project work would occur within existing office or laboratory space where no physical modifications or ground disturbing activities would be required and no change in the use of the facilities would result from project activities. No modifications to permits or new permits, additional licenses and/or authorizations would be necessary for proposed project activities. The project would involve the use and handling of natural gas and hydrogen. Handling and testing with natural gas and hydrogen would occur in a dedicated, well ventilated laboratory space. All facilities where work would occur are built in compliance with applicable codes and standards and operated by experienced staff with a history of successfully working with these hazards. All applicable safety protocols and procedures, including regular training, hazard assessment, engineering controls, monitoring and proper personal protective equipment (PPE) would be followed. All test systems would be reviewed for their safety and code compliance and any changes to those systems would be handled through a management of change process. The TEG unit itself is safe to handle and does not involve any special PPE. Total air emissions from testing would be minimal and temporary. Waste handling and removal would be handled according to GTI's corporate waste management plan. DOE does not anticipate any impacts to resources of concern due to the proposed activities of the project.

The proposed action (or the part of the proposal defined in the Rationale above) fits within a class of actions that is listed in Appendix A or B to 10 CFR Part 1021, Subpart D. This proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.25(a)(1)), is not related to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.27(b)(7)), and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or 10 CFR 1021.211 concerning limitations on actions during preparation of an environmental impact statement.

The proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
