FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT

Herbicide Application at Three Western Area Power Administration Substations Maricopa and Yuma Counties, Arizona; Imperial County, California DOE/EA-2013

AGENCY: U.S. Department of Energy, Western Area Power Administration

ACTION: Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI)

BACKGROUND: U.S. Department of Energy (DOE), Western Area Power Administration (Western) operates and maintains three substations located on lands administered by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) in Maricopa County, Arizona; Yuma County, Arizona; and Imperial County, California. Western must manage vegetation near and within substations to provide a safe and reliable supply of electricity and to prevent blackouts and wildfires, which can harm people, wildlife, habitat, and property.

Under the Proposed Action, Western would use herbicides, in addition to manual and mechanical methods, to manage undesirable vegetation at substations. Because these substations are on BLM lands, the BLM must decide whether to issue Pesticide Use Permits for the Proposed Action. Western and the BLM, as co-lead federal agencies, prepared an Environmental Assessment (EA) analyzing the Proposed Action and a No Action Alternative. The EA is titled "Herbicide Application at Three Western Area Power Administration Substations (DOE/EA-2013)" and dated January 25, 2016.

DETERMINATION: Based on the analysis contained in DOE/EA-2013, Western determines that the Proposed Action to use herbicides to manage vegetation at three substations on BLM lands does not constitute a major Federal action significantly affecting the quality of the human environment within the meaning of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) (See DOE/EA 2013, Table 3-1, Resources and Rationale for Detailed Analysis). The Proposed Action will not impact any floodplains or wetlands. Therefore, preparation of an environmental impact statement is not required.
