Recommendation to the Department of Energy
"Fiscal Year 2013 and 2014 Budget Appropriation Recommendation"
No. 2012-03
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The Department of Energy (DOE), The Los Alamos National Laboratory (LANL) and the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED), signed the Order on Consent, for clean- up of Legacy and Cold War wastes in March 2005. In this document, LANL agreed to a schedule for completion of cleanup at specified sites on the LANL grounds. At the time of signing this agreement, this team indicated that appropriate cleanup could be completed by the end of 2015. DOE EM agreed to provide sufficient funding to the Environmental Management Division (EM) of LANL to meet the cleanup timeframe. To date, federal funding has not been sufficient to meet these timeframes.

Since Operating Budgets have not been sufficiently funded to carry out the requirements in the Order on Consent, LANL and NMED have had to renegotiate the work priorities, scope, and deadlines. On October 1, 2011, a "Framework Agreement" was reached, wherein LANL agreed to remove 3,706 cubic meters of non-cemented, above-ground TRU waste by June 3, 2014. In order to fulfill this agreement, sufficient funding is essential to complete the necessary work.

Comments and Observations

 According to the DOE Office of Environmental Management FY 2013 Budget Request, LANL's Base Budget Request is approximately \$239.1 million.³ The Executive Budget Request submitted for FY 14 was \$239.1 million. Since then, the Senate reduced the FY '14 amount to \$235.0 million, and the House reduced the amount to \$217.0 million. To this day, the federal government operates under a Continuing Resolution, thereby shortening the work schedule for LANL's clean-up efforts.

The Northern New Mexico Citizen's Advisory Board (NNMCAB) has consistently recommended as one of its "Top Three Issues" reported to EM Headquarters, the full budget baseline funding levels for the agreed LANL EM work. In addition, LANL budget prioritization is an Action Item on both the Waste Management subcommittee, and the Environmental Monitoring, Remediation and Surveillance subcommittee within the NNMCAB.

Recommendation

1. The NNMCAB recommends that DOE Headquarters inform the Congressional Appropriations Committee that in order for LANL- EM to fulfill the scope of work included in the Consent Order, and to address health and safety considerations in and

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- around the Los Alamos area, full baseline funding included in the Executive Budget
 Request is essential. Any decrease from that amount would be detrimental to established
 deadlines in the Consent Order and the Framework Agreement between DOE and NMED.
 The NNMCAB acknowledges that the funding issues associated with the current
 Continuing Resolution budget will have a negative impact on Environmental Restoration
 work at LANL. The NNMCAB is very concerned about the potential for increased risk of
 - Continuing Resolution budget will have a negative impact on Environmental Restoration work at LANL. The NNMCAB is very concerned about the potential for increased risk of contamination to both groundwater and the Rio Grande from any delays in the removal or remediation of LANL wastes will result from budget shortfalls. Therefore, we strongly recommend that DOE EM pursue as strongly as possible the full baseline funding for LANL EM work.

<u>Intent</u>

 It is the intent of the NNMCAB to support FY 2013 and FY 2014 funding for LANL at levels that will adequately support clean-up work in progress, in order to complete scope on the Consent Order schedule deadlines, and to fulfill DOE-EM, LANL, and NMED agreements.
