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The Office of Environment, Health, Safety and Security (AU) - Our Mission



- <u>Understand the AU mission</u> and the organization that may need your service or product.
 - Our acquisitions are typically services that support the AU and DOE headquarters mission.
 - Our labs may contract for different services and products and so they have independent procurement shops from headquarters procurement.

 - NAICS 561621 Security Systems Services (except Locksmiths)
 Anticipated value \$25M
 - Anticipated award date, January 2020
- Security Protective Force Services Provides Physical Protection Services for DOE Facilities and Personnel. Small business set-aside.
 - NAICS 561612 Security Guards and Patrol Services

Anticipated value \$150M

Anticipated award date, March 2020
