

## **CITIZENS WORKING FOR THE FUTURE**

The Portsmouth Site Specific Advisory Board (PORTS SSAB) was formed in 2008 as a Department of Energy Environmental Management (EM) Advisory Board, which is chartered under the Federal Advisory Committee Act. The PORTS SSAB is comprised of individuals with diverse interests and concerns related to the PORTS environmental management activities.

Board membership reflects a full diversity of views, cultures, and demographics from affected communities and regions. Members may include stakeholders from local government, environmental and civic groups, labor, universities, industry, and other interested parties. The Ohio Environmental Protection Agency and the Ohio Department of Health serve as liaision members.

The SSAB meets regularly to hear from individuals working on relevant environmental efforts, listen to input from concerned citizens, form advice and recommendations to submit to DOE, and conduct CAB business.

The goal of the PORTS SSAB is to ensure high quality, timely, meaningful, and effective public participation in decisions regarding environmental management and related DOE activies at the PORTS site.
