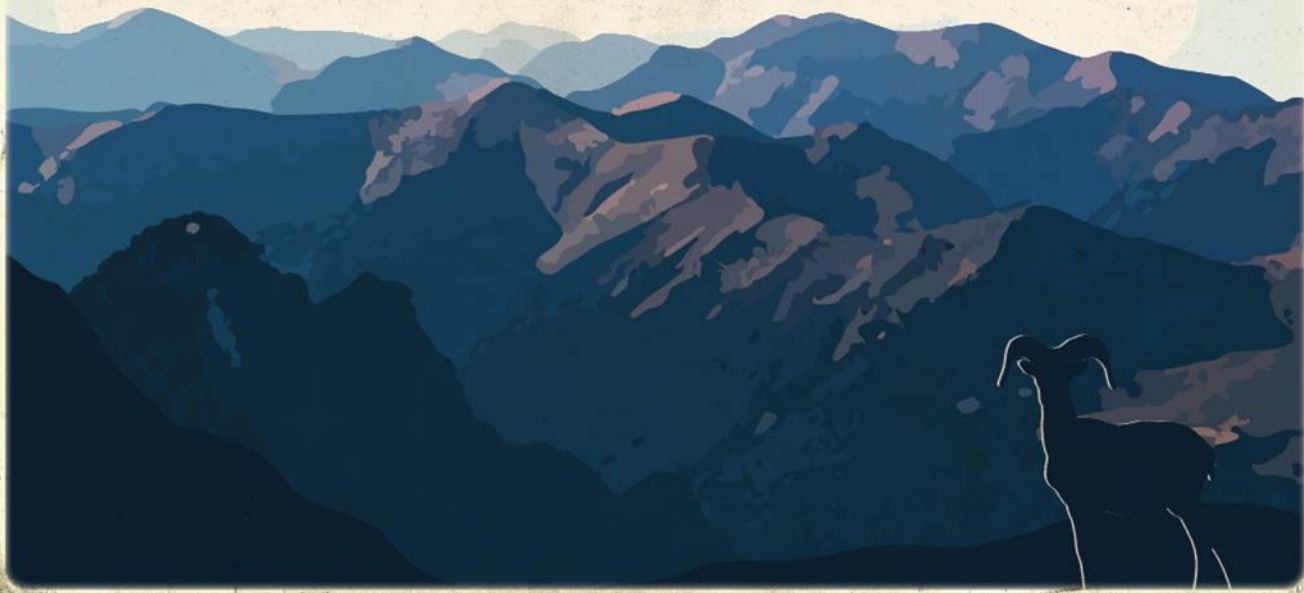


Cerro CHILE Pachón
