




An organization's values and behaviors—modeled by its leaders and internalized by its members—that serve to make nuclear safety the overriding priority

INPO Safety Culture Principles

- Everyone is personally responsible for nuclear safety.
- 2. Leaders demonstrate commitment to safety.
- 3. Trust permeates the organization.
- 4. Decision-making reflects safety first.
- 5. Nuclear technology is recognized as special and unique.
- 6. A questioning attitude is cultivated.
- 7. Organizational learning is embraced.
- 8. Nuclear safety undergoes constant examination.


Conclusions
