NOTICE OF CORPORATE REORGANIZATION OR CHANGE IN CONTROL AND AMENDMENT OF PENDING APPLICATION TO EXPORT LIQUIFIED NATURAL GAS TO NON-FREE TRADE AGREEMENT COUNTRIES

Notice is hereby given that Pangea LNG (North America) Holdings, LLC, (Pangea) the applicant in the above-captioned proceeding, is authorized to implement a corporate reorganization or other change in control and to amend the named applicant in this proceeding, as requested in an application submitted on March 31, 2014 (Application), to the U.S. Department of Energy, Office of Fossil Energy (DOE/FE). Also, Pangea is authorized to amend its application in the above-captioned proceeding by changing the point from which proposed exports will be made. In the Application, Pangea describes a corporate reorganization or change in control and proposes to change the applicant in the non-FTA proceedings from Pangea to a new entity named Next Decade Partners, LLC (Next Decade). Pangea states that Next Decade, is a U.S. based company that is developing LNG liquefaction solutions in North America.

Pangea describes other aspects of its corporation reorganization in the Application at 5-6 and 13-15.

According to Pangea, Next Decade Partners, LLC is a Delaware limited liability company with its principal place of business in The Woodlands, Texas.

In the Application, Pangea also requests leave to amend the pending proposed export authorization by changing the point from which exports will be made from the Port of Corpus Christi in Ingleside, Texas to the San Martin-Boca Chica site along the Brownsville Ship Channel in Cameron County, Texas. No other material changes to the proposed export authorization have been submitted.

Pangea provided a certificate of service with its Application stating that it had served a copy of the Application on all persons on the official service list in this proceeding. No responses or answers in opposition to the Application have been received.

DOE/FE has reviewed the Application and finds that it has not been shown that Pangea's notice of the corporate reorganization or other change in control, or the proposed amendment of the point of export are inconsistent with the public interest. 15 U.S.C. § 717b(a). Accordingly, pursuant to the Office of Fossil Energy's Revised Procedures for a Change in Control³ and DOE's regulations at 10 C.F.R. § 590.204, Pangea's Application has been granted and given effect.

Next Decade Partners, LLC is hereby named the new applicant in the pending proceeding captioned above and the proposed point of export has been changed from Port of Corpus Christi in Ingleside, Texas to The San Martin-Boca Chica Site in Cameron County, Texas.
