HUD's Role in the Partnership for Tribal Sustainability, Preparedness, Recovery, Resiliency

- Regular housing programs: Office of Native American Programs
- Long Term Disaster Recovery: Community Development Block Grant Disaster Relief
- Special Initiatives:
 - National Disaster Resilience Competition
 - Sustainable Communities Initiative
 - Sustainable Construction in Indian Country Initiative



HUD's Office of Native American Programs (ONAP)

Administers programs authorized under:

 Native American Housing Assistance and Self Determination Act (NAHASDA) of 1996

~\$650M for Indian Housing Block Grant (IHBG)

Title One of the Housing and Community
 Development Act of 1974


~\$55M in for Indian Community Development Block Grant (ICDBG)

FY14, w/~\$4M set-aside for Imminent Threat Grants



IHGB – Program Expenditures (\$Millions) FY08-13

- Direct Allocation to >580 tribes
- Significant, direct investment for housing rehab and new construction.
- Supports "moderate design" and tribes are constrained by TDC, but waivers exist for green technology and other tribal exceptions








ICDBG – Activities and Imminent Grant Threat Grants

- Competitive single-purpose grants for creation of decent housing, suitable living environments, and economic opportunities primarily for persons with low and moderate incomes. Extra point for green building / renewable energy standards
 - Ex: \$900k for energy efficient rental homes for Chippewa-Cree Tribe, MN
- IT set-asides to alleviate or remove imminent threats to health or safety that require an immediate solution
 - Ex: \$900k for water/sewer work in Galena, AK after floods

Primary Federal Sources for Disaster Recovery

- Federal Emergency Management Agency w/ Specific Tribal Policies
 - Disaster Assistance Recognizes Tribal Sovereignty
 - Individual Assistance
 - Public Assistance 25% Cost Share
 - Resiliency and Mitigation
 - Hazard Mitigation Grants Program (HMGP) (Available to Presidentially declared disasters) - 25% Cost Share
 - National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP)
 - Disaster Preparedness
 - Tribal Homeland Security Grant Program (THSGP) for Preparedness
- Small Business Administration & Army Corps of Engineers
 - SBA Low interest loans to individuals (<\$200k) and businesses (<\$2M)
 - USACE responsible for carrying out large-scale engineering projects






HUD Community Development Block Grant – Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR)

- Supplemental Appropriation to States and Local Governments for unmet housing, economic and infrastructure needs
- Appropriation language does not allow tribes to receive funding directly


CDBG-DR Supplemental Appropriations (in \$Millions)





CDBG - National Disaster Resilience Competition (NDRC)

- Fairly allocates remaining ~\$1B PL 113-2 CDBG disaster funds.
- Provides resources to plan and implement disaster recovery that makes communities more resilient to future economic or natural shocks while improving quality of life

What you should remember

- You can leverage existing HUD Tribal programs to promote sustainable, energy efficient housing
- You can pursue competitive ICDBG single purpose grants for a wide range of projects, including resilience and infrastructure projects
- ICDBG Imminent Threat grants are available for immediate recovery needs
- You can work with State governments to apply for the CDBG-NDRC competition, but Phase I applications are due March 27
- Providing Congressional action, CDBG-DR can be available to fill gaps of FEMA and SBA disaster recovery programs
