

Renewable Energy Resources



Secondary (Waste) Products for Local Energy

Biomass Wastes

- Food wastes
- Saw mill waste
- Forest waste
- Municipal solid waste
- Crop waste
- Animal waste
- Waste water treatment plants
- Any other waste from nearby industry, including heat waste

Cogeneration

- Utilize both heat and power
- Increased system efficiency
- Greater rate of return on investment

Natural Gas:

- Gas from nearby pipeline
- Heat from nearby compressor station

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Energy and Mineral Development Program (EMDP):

- Provides financial assistance and inhouse technical support to Tribes for performing data collection and investigations of their energy and mineral potential.
- An annual program using a competitive evaluation process to select proposed projects from tribes.
- Tribes use this information to
 - plan where they want development to occur;
 - promote their lands to industry partners;
 - negotiate the best economically beneficial agreement with partners;
 - develop the resource themselves









2014 EMDP Grant Awards



- DEMD received a total of 79 proposals from tribes totaling just over \$28 million
- Over \$9.46 million was awarded to 45 tribal projects for the 2014 EMDP grant year

Tribal Energy Development Capacity (TEDC) Grant Program



Purpose: to develop tribal managerial, organizational and technical capacity needed to maximize the economic impact of energy resource development on Indian land

Provides financial assistance for tribes to:

- Establish business entity structures and/or organizational structures related to energy resource development; and/or
- 2. Develop or enhance key regulatory activities

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TEDC Grant FY 2013 Funding

- 31 TEDC grant applications from tribes located in all 12 BIA Regions
- Amount requested: \$3,062,180.37
- 9 tribes funded
- Amount funded: \$738,039.51
