Greenhouse gas emission data is helping researchers develop more sustainable biofuels

With Bioenergy Technologies Office funding, researchers at Argonne National Laboratory developed the Greenhouse gases, Regulated Emissions, and Energy use in Transportation (GREET) model to develop non-food biofuels from agricultural residues, forestry trimmings, energy crops, and algae that have greater greenhouse gas reduction benefits compared to petroleum fuels.
