Project Location

- Seneca Nation is one of the Six Nations of the Iroquois Confederacy, or Haudenosaunee ("People of the Longhouse")
- ♦ 4 Distinct Territories in Western New York State
 - ♦ Allegany (30,984 acres)
 Cattaraugus (21,618 acres)
 - ✤ Oil Springs (1 sq. mi.)Niagara Falls (50 acres)
- Abundant Natural Resources
- Located in Prime Transportation Corridors





Seneca Overview

- ✤ 4 Territories = approx. 90 square miles of land in restricted fee status Canandaigua Treaty of 1794
- *7,277 Enrolled members
- 3,695 Reside on the Cattaraugus or Allegany territory





Seneca Overview, cont.

- Elected form of government, with a Tribal Council consisting of 16 members
- Nation employs over 500, with an additional 2500 currently employed in our gaming operations
- Enterprises include: 3 convenient store/gas stations, 2 Class II gaming centers, a museum, a 250 site camping resort, 1 operating Class III casino, and 2 add'1 Class III casinos in development.


