## SECTION B. Project Description

The University of Wisconsin proposes to upgrade the health physics (HP) radiation monitoring equipment to support the operation and research being conducted at the University of Wisconsin Nuclear Reactor (UWNR) and associated Characterization Laboratory for Irradiated Materials (CLIM). Specifically it is proposed to replace the failing count rate meters, survey meters, and ion chambers.

## SECTION C. Environmental Aspects / Potential Sources of Impact

All of these HP instruments are utilized to maintain regulatory compliance and to monitor radiation exposure to visitors to the UWNR and CLIM. The goals for the use of the proposed equipment is to maintain regulatory compliance and ensure safety of the researchers and members of the public who visit and work at the facility. The action would not create additional environmental impacts above those already occurring at the university.
