Dear Sir or Madam:

As required by DOE/FE Order No. 3555, issued on December 2, 2014, SeaOne Gulfport, LLC ("SeaOne") hereby files its sixth semi-annual report.

Progress of the Facility: As previously reported, Front End Engineering and Design ("FEED") for the entire project was completed on schedule in December 2016. SeaOne opened an administrative and operations office in Gulfport, Mississippi, on May 22, 2017. However, the Port of Gulfport has not yet given SeaOne complete access to its site at Terminal 4 on the Port, due in part to a pattern of unusually heavy rainfall, and also the award of the construction contract to complete the surfacing of the site, which have delayed the Port's timeline for completing the site preparations that will allow SeaOne to begin construction. Negotiation of the Engineering, Procurement, Construction, Installation, Commissioning and Start-up (EPCIC/S) contract for Phases 1, 2 and 3 facilities is in progress. On May 19, 2017, SeaOne signed a Letter of Intent for the construction of twelve CGL Articulated Tub/Barge (AT/B) and on September 19, 2017, SeaOne signed a Letter of Intent with Sembcorp for the construction of several large CGL Carriers. An owner/operator of the products pipelines for delivery of hydrocarbons to SeaOne Gulfport's CGL Production and Export Facility has been selected.

We acknowledge receipt of your September 5, 2017, message requesting that holders of "long-term authorization to export domestically produced liquefied or compressed natural gas" provide

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“information regarding the construction progress on each train at your facility, if applicable.” We note that SeaOne does not intend to export either LNG or CNG, and that construction of SeaOne Gulfport’s CGL Production and Export Facility involves a much smaller footprint, safer and simpler technology, relatively rapid construction, and a much reduced environmental impact (e.g., is a far simpler, a zero carbon footprint at site, using no process water, creating no process effluent or wastewater runoff) as compared to the large and complex facilities required for the production and export of LNG.

Anticipated Start Date of Operations: Due to the continued delays in site access at Gulfport, SeaOne has moved the Financial Investment Decision (“FID”) to not earlier than early 2018. Based on this decision, the projected date for commencement of full commercial operations has been adjusted to mid-2020.

Status of Long Term Export or Supply Contracts: SeaOne is finalizing several long and medium-term fuel services agreements (“FSAs”) with customers in the Caribbean Basin, the Gulf of Mexico, and Colombia. SeaOne has progressed beyond the current Heads of Agreements with its customers and is finalizing FSA Term Sheets with each of its customers in each market.

In addition to markets in the Caribbean Basin and the Gulf of Mexico, SeaOne has developed a market for CGL in Colombia and is negotiating contracts for delivery of CGL to that country. A site has been selected for a CGL Receiving Terminal, in Cartagena and Buenaventura, Colombia, with related agreements expected to be finalized shortly.

We note that substantially all of the production and exports from SeaOne’s Gulfport Facility will be to Columbia and the Dominican Republic, and that these shipments will not require a NFTA export authorization.
