### Categorical Exclusion Applied (from Subpart D, 10 C.F.R. Part 1021):

B1.3 Routine Maintenance

**Description of the Proposed Action:** BPA is proposing to repair approximately 1.7 miles of access roads within the Kalispell District. Access road work would include the reconstruction of 599 LF of roadway and the improvement of 8,582 LF of existing roadway. Proposed road work would include: blading, shaping, grading, brushing, and placing surface rock on existing road prisms to ensure safe access to structures. In addition, the proposed road work would include: repair of four landings; repair of two turnarounds; and installation of drainage features such as a ford, eight water bars, and two drain dips.

BPA has easements for the roads. The underlying landowners crossed include the US Forest Service and private ownership.
