<u>Categorical Exclusion Applied (from Subpart D, 10 C.F.R. Part 1021)</u>: B5.1 Actions to Conserve Energy or Water

<u>Description of the Proposed Action</u>: Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) proposes to replace the existing landscaping at its Netkipe Maintenance Headquarters in Pasco, Washington with xeriscaping, to help reduce the reliance on supplemental irrigation at the site. Approximately 1.5 acres of lawn and existing landscaping would be removed and replaced with drought tolerant plants that would require significantly less irrigation. The work would include re-planting of four existing stormwater bioswales on the property.

The new plantings would include but are not limited to the following species: Armstrong gold red maple, chokecherry, serviceberry, sagebrush, gray rabbitbrush, bitterbrush, western white yarrow, balsamroot, fleabane, buckwheat, biscuitroot, penstemon, phlox, Idaho fescue, bluebunch wheatgrass, and kinnikinnick. A weed barrier would be installed prior to planting. Compost, soil amendments, and top soil would be applied to the new plantings. Shrubs and trees would be mulched with wood chips. Additional river rock and accent boulders would be imported to the site. Some bare ground would remain to provide habitat to ground-nesting bees, and a small water rock basin would provide a water source for pollinators.

Irrigation would be installed for this project and used until the new vegetation is established. After the new plants are established, the irrigation would be left in place for use during times of drought.

The existing pergola on the west side of the building would have additional slats added to the roof to provide more shade on the employee patio.

The project would require use of small mechanical equipment, such as a mini excavator, small backhoe and a walk-behind trench machine. Supplies and equipment would be brought to the project location via a flatbed truck and debris would be hauled off site by a dump truck.

Findings: In accordance with Section 1021.410(b) of the Department of Energy's (DOE) National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Regulations (57 FR 15144, Apr. 24, 1992, as amended at 61 FR 36221-36243, July 9, 1996; 61 FR 64608, Dec. 6, 1996, 76 FR 63764, Nov. 14, 2011), BPA has determined that the proposed action:

(1) fits within a class of actions listed in Appendix B of 10 CFR 1021, Subpart D (see attached Environmental Checklist);

- (2) does not present any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal; and
- (3) has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion.

Based on these determinations, BPA finds that the proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
