Enforcement Policy Statement – Furnace Fans

Issued: November 2, 2018

Rescinded: February 11, 2019

The enforcement policy statement issued November 2, 2018, regarding consumer furnace fan

regulations is rescinded. DOE notes that compliance with the consumer furnace fan standards is

not required until July 3, 2019.

Background: The Air Conditioning, Heating, and Refrigeration Institute (AHRI) submitted a

petition for rulemaking requesting that DOE consider establishing a combined metric for

consumer furnaces that would include standby power and the power used by the furnace fan

rather than subjecting furnace fans to a separate standard. AHRI stated that, if DOE were to do

so, requiring manufacturers to test and comply with the current Fan Energy Rating (FER) test

procedure (10 C.F.R. 430.23(cc) and 10 C.F.R. Part 430, Subpart B, Appendix AA) and standard

(10 C.F.R. 430.32(y)) while developing the combined metric would result in unnecessary costs

to manufacturers. In response, DOE issued an enforcement policy stating that, while DOE

considers AHRI's petition for rulemaking, DOE would not enforce the testing, certification, and

standards compliance requirements for consumer furnace fans. In response to DOE's policy

statement, DOE received comments from a wide variety of parties opposing the enforcement

policy. In addition, on February 8, 2019, AHRI submitted a letter requesting that DOE rescind

the enforcement policy.
