Enforcement Policy Statement – Furnace Fans

Issued: November 2, 2018

The Air Conditioning, Heating, and Refrigeration Institute (AHRI) has submitted a petition for rulemaking requesting that DOE consider establishing a combined metric for consumer furnaces that would include standby power and the power used by the furnace fan rather than subjecting furnace fans to a separate standard. AHRI states that, if DOE were to so, requiring manufacturers to test and comply with the current FER test programmed to the current F R. 430.32(cc) and 0.32(y)) while 10 C.F.R.
