Categorical Exclusion Applied (from Subpart D, 10 C.F.R. Part 1021): B1.19 Microwave,

meteorological, and radio towers

<u>Description of the Proposed Action</u>: Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) proposes to allow PacifiCorp to install one UHX whip antenna on BPA's Kennewick radio tower. The new 10-foot-tall antenna would be installed at the 20-foot level on the 80-foot-tall lattice tower. Additionally, PacifiCorp would replace indoor radio equipment, within the BPA equipment building at the site.

<u>Findings</u>: In accordance with Section 1021.410(b) of the Department of Energy's (DOE) National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Regulations (57 FR 15144, Apr. 24, 1992, as amended at 61 FR 36221-36243, Jul. 9, 1996; 61 FR 64608, Dec. 6, 1996, 76 FR 63764, Nov. 14, 2011), BPA has determined that the proposed action:

- (1) fits within a class of actions listed in Appendix B of 10 CFR 1021, Subpart D (see attached Environmental Checklist):
- (2) does not present any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal; and
- (3) has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion.

Based on these determinations, BPA finds that the proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.

# **Categorical Exclusion Environmental Checklist**

#### **Project Site Description**

The project area is on a butte known as Jump Off Joe Ridge in Benton County, Washington, approximately three miles south of the city of Kennewick. The butte is developed with approximately fifteen other communication towers on the hill top. The surrounding area consists of wind farms and agricultural fields. The proposed tower and fiber installation is in Section 29, Township 7 North, Range 29 East.

The project location is graveled and devoid of vegetation. The nearest waterbody is an unnamed intermittent stream, located 0.20 miles south of the project location. There are no wetlands in the area.
