A. <u>Brief Description of Proposal</u>: Western Area Power Administration (WAPA), Rocky Mountain Region (RMR), completed an emergency jumper replacement on Structure 4/2 of the Miracle Mile-Seminoe (MM-S) 115-kV Transmission Line, also known as Structure TAP.KOT.K of the Kortes Tap-Kortes (KOT-K) 115-kV Transmission Line. This work occurred July 26-30, 2019, on public lands managed by the Bureau of Land Management and Bureau of Reclamation in Carbon County, Wyoming. On July 26, 2019, the lowest jumper on Structure 4/2 broke and contacted the ground, igniting a small grass fire at the base of the structure. No firefighting efforts were required. When WAPA crews attempted to reach the structure, they determined access road maintenance and landing construction was necessary to bring in the equipment needed for the jumper replacement. Intermittent roadwork and removal of fallen timber was completed on WAPA's access road between Seminoe Road and Structure 4/2. In addition, a landing was constructed within WAPA's right-of-way (ROW) at Structure 4/2. Once the structure was accessed, the broken jumper was replaced and all equipment was removed from the area. Equipment used for the project included ATVs/UTVs, bucket trucks, an excavator, and utility trucks.

B. Special Stipulations Pertaining to the Proposal:

This Categorical Exclusion (CX) covers emergency work that has already been completed. No further work is authorized under this CX. If additional work is required, RMR's Environment Department must be contacted to determine whether additional environmental review is required.
