Based on my review of the information concerning the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (authorized under DOE Policy 451.1), I have made the following determination:

CX, EA, EIS APPENDIX AND NUMBER:

Description:

B3.11 Outdoor tests and experiments for the development, quality assurance, or reliability of materials and equipment (including, but not limited to, weapon system components) under controlled conditions. Covered actions include, but are not limited to, burn tests (such as tests of electric cable fire resistance or the combustion characteristics of fuels), impact tests (such as pneumatic ejector tests using earthen embankments or concrete slabs designated and routinely used for that purpose), or drop, puncture, water-immersion, or thermal tests. Covered actions would not involve source, special nuclear, or byproduct materials, except encapsulated sources manufactured to applicable standards that contain source, special nuclear, or byproduct materials may be used for nondestructive actions such as detector/sensor development and testing and first responder field training.

Rationale for determination:

The Department of Energy's National Renewable Energy Laboratory (NREL), in collaboration with NextEra, is proposing to conduct field studies and data gathering to study the interactions of multiple wind turbines in wind farms, specifically how the wakes of individual turbines affect those that are located down wind.

This project builds on research activities conducted in a previous cooperative research and development agreement between DOE and NextEra Energy (reference NREL-17-003 and NREL-17-003B) that involved collecting meteorological data gathering and demonstrating wake steering through yaw control at the Peetz Table Wind Energy Center in northeast Colorado.

The activities proposed for this project would involve NREL research staff installing strain gauge measurement instruments onto two of the turbines within the same 5 turbine cluster used in the previous research projects. The gauges would be installed into the turbine nacelle and run up onto the blades. All work would be conducted on the turbines and no ground disturbance would occur.

All project activities would comply with existing NREL health and safety policies and procedures, including employee training, proper protective equipment, engineering controls, proper material handling, monitoring, and internal assessments. Additional policies and procedures would be developed if additional health and safety risks are identified.
