# **C-400 REMEDIAL INVESTIGATION/FEASABILITY STUDY**



## C-400 Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study Work Plan Field Work

- October 1, 2019 EPA and Kentucky approved the C-400 RI/FS Work Plan
- November 11, 2019 Field work began

OFFICE OF

- Rehabilitation/maintenance of existing monitoring wells
- Gamma Walkover Surveys
- February 2020 Drilling activities anticipated to begin with field work expected to last 16 months
- Information collected during field work will be used to develop the RI/FS Report and subsequently to support remedy selection for a final remedial action at the C-400 Complex

# **C-531 Switchyard Deactivation**

Ongoing and future work to include:

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ENVIRONMENTAL

- Isolating utilities air, steam, power, phones, etc.
- Draining oil from large electrical power equipment
- Recycling ~210,000 gallons of dielectric oils

## PADUCAH GASEOUS DIFFUSION PLANT CITIZENS ADVISORY BOARD

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### Paducah Gaseous Diffusion Plant Citizens Advisory Board Meeting Minutes January 16, 2020 The Citizens Advisory Board (CAB) met at the West Kentucky Community and Technical College in Paducah, Kentucky on Thursday, January 16<sup>th</sup> at 6:05 p.m.

**Board members present:** Bill Murphy, Mike Kemp, Victoria Caldwell, Fran Johnson, Celeste Emerson, Shay Morgan, David Homra, Judy Clayton, Blake Summarell, Don Barger and Phil Brown (on phone).

Board Members absent: Patrick White, Carol Young, Nancy Duff and Cindy Butterbaugh.

Barger called the meeting to order and called for introductions. He then reviewed the Agenda.

**DOE Comments:** Woodard reported that the continuing resolution ended during the month of December and a budget was passed. **Kemp** asked if the level of the budget was the amount requested. **Woodard** said that it was.

**Federal Coordinator Comments: Smith** said that the DOE Science Bowl would be held during February again and asked for any volunteers to contact him to get signed up.

**Liaison Comments: Begley** reported that Kentucky had applied for two grants from DOE but had not received any funds at this point. He added that they had been operating on general funds since January 1. **Begley** then said that several employees had been through training to be able to provide oversight for the C-400 work when it starts. He then said that there were a couple of documents currently being reviewed by the department. **Murphy** asked if there would be any problems doing work if the DOE grant money was delayed getting to the state. **Woodard** said that the grant was supposed to be issued late today or tomorrow (1/16-17/2020).

**Woodard** then provided a project update presentation on the C-400 RI/FS, construction of the TVA substation, and the C-531 switchyard deactivation. **Murphy** asked if the gamma walkover was performed by walking over the area with a gamma detector. **Woodard** said that is how it is done. **Kemp** asked if that would detect any residual radioactivity. **Woodard** said that it would detect any activity. **Clayton** commented that it was not a chemical sampling. **Brock** then commented that it was only gamma emitters. **Barger** asked how much weather impacted drilling. **Woodard** said that the weather hasn't impacted the drilling that much, but it has impacted the gamma walkovers. **Murphy** asked what the new drilling activities were concerning. **Woodard** said that it is in support of the C-400 Feasibility Study. **Begley** added that all the wells were to help discover what was under the C-400 building. **Woodard** then said that a presentation could be done to inform the Board on all the drilling activities being done on this project. **Begley** added that the wells were spread fairly evenly spatially over the C-400 area, as well as vertically. **Barger** asked what happens to the soil that is withdrawn when doing the drilling. **Woodard** indicated that it is disposed of as waste.

**Murphy** asked if the new switchyard being constructed is just outside the plant fence. **Woodard** said that the new switchyard is outside the current fence but has a fence of its own. She said that the C-531 Switchyard that is being deactivated is inside the plant fence. **Murphy** then asked if the new switchyard just go to the Shawnee plant. **Woodard** indicated that that was right, and the Paducah site will be off the national power grid. **Murphy** asked if Electric Energy Inc. (EEI) was still operational since the closure of the plant operations. **Woodard** said that as far as she knew, EEI was still in operation and had not seen any plans to close. **Caldwell** asked if the metal structures from the switchyard would be recycled. **Woodard** indicated that it would be eventually, but that was not a part of this project.

**Barger** then introduced information concerning the Spring EM SSAB Chairs meeting. He asked the Board if there were any topics of concern at the Paducah site that might be presented during the Chairs meeting. Murphy mentioned that transportation was a common concern across the different sites in the complex, but he wondered if there was concern when the Paducah site would start to transport some of the larger pieces of equipment for disposal. Woodard said that prior to shipment, routes are verified to be up to the standards for shipments traveling on those roads. Murphy asked if the routes that would be used to transport the converters been verified. Woodard indicated that that would be accomplished a few days to a few weeks before the shipment would leave the site. **Roberts** said that it might be possible to obtain a presentation concerning transportation issues that was made during the Fall EM SSAB Chairs meeting and could forward that to the Board for more information. Barger said that during that Chairs meeting a recommendation was presented but the Chairs were unable to finalize the recommendation for vote. Murphy asked if transporting materials past high traffic areas, such at around the Paducah mall area, was of concern. Woodard said that any oversized, overweight load is of concern, no matter what is being transported. She added that there were other routes that might be used. Brock added that the Radiation Health Branch did escort high activity shipments through the state along with Kentucky State Police. Murphy asked if there was any plan to let the public know about shipments prior to shipping. Woodard said that they had not worked through that process yet.

**Kemp** commented that he thought that it would be good to introduce at a Chairs meeting the things that are working for the Paducah site. He indicated that an example would be the presentation done by the Risk and Communication subcommittee on presenting site success to the public.

Roberts updated the members on meeting changes on the CAB Workplan.

Public Comments: none.

**Final Comments:** Murphy announced that Johnson had recently retired from the Paducah Chamber of Commerce and congratulated her for her years of service.

**Barger** adjourned the meeting at 6:54 pm.
