Transfers

<u>Description of the Proposed Action</u>: Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) proposes to transfer ownership of several hatchery facilities to the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation (CTUIR). BPA provides funding for the Umatilla Basin Artificial Propagation Program, co-managed by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife and the CTUIR, as partial fulfillment of BPAs fish and wildlife mitigation responsibilities. BPA initially funded construction of the facilities with the intent to ultimately transfer ownership to CTUIR.

The following facilities would be transferred to CTUIR ownership:

- Catherine Creek Juvenile Acclimation Facility,
- Catherine Creek Adult Holding Facility,
- Three Mile Dam Fish Facility,
- Upper Grande Ronde Juvenile Acclimation Facility.

This proposal does not include transfer of the underlying property ownership. No ground disturbing activities are proposed as part of this undertaking.

Findings: In accordance with Section 1021.410(b) of the Department of Energy's (DOE) National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Regulations (57 FR 15144, Apr. 24, 1992, as amended at 61 FR 36221-36243, Jul. 9, 1996; 61 FR 64608, Dec. 6, 1996, 76 FR 63764, Nov. 14, 2011), BPA has determined that the proposed action:

- (1) fits within a class of actions listed in Appendix B of 10 CFR 1021, Subpart D (see attached Environmental Checklist);
- (2) does not present any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal; and
- (3) has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion.

Based on these determinations, BPA finds that the proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
