I received your voicemail following our telephone conversation yesterday. My proposed clarifying edit to Ordering Paragraph (A) in Order No. 3147-B/3978-C (3/24/20) is set forth below. It borrows from the wording of Order No. 3147, as follows:

"Golden Pass LNG Terminal LLC (GPLNG) is authorized to export domestically produced LNG by vessel from the Golden Pass Terminal in Sabine Pass, Texas, in a volume equivalent to 740 Bcf per year of natural gas for a 25-year term beginning on the earlier of (i) the date of first export or (ii) commencing on September 30, 2025. GPLNG is authorized to export the LNG on its own behalf and as agent for other entities who hold title to the natural gas, pursuant to one or more long-term contracts (a contract greater than two years)."

This revision is intended to clarify that Golden Pass LNG's exports to FTA countries can commence before 9/30/25. The clarification is consistent with the structure of the authorization term as stated in Order No. 3147.
