Categorical Exclusion Applied (from Subpart D, 10 C.F.R. Part 1021): B4.9 Multiple use of

powerline rights-of-way

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<u>Description of the Proposed Action</u>: Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) proposes to allow Comcast to install fiber optic cable across the BPA fee-owned Longview-Washington Way transmission line right-of way. Approximately 534 feet of fiber optic cable would be attached to transmission structures 1/18, 2/1 and 2/2 along the Longview-Washington Way line. Equipment and vehicles would be parked on paved areas off BPA right-of-way. No ground disturbance would occur.

Findings: In accordance with Section 1021.410(b) of the Department of Energy's (DOE) National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Regulations (57 FR 15144, Apr. 24, 1992, as amended at 61 FR 36221-36243, Jul. 9, 1996; 61 FR 64608, Dec. 6, 1996, 76 FR 63764, Nov. 14, 2011), BPA has determined that the proposed action:

- (1) fits within a class of actions listed in Appendix B of 10 CFR 1021, Subpart D (see attached Environmental Checklist);
- (2) does not present any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal; and
- (3) has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion.

Based on these determinations, BPA finds that the proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.

## **Project Site Description**

Most of the transmission line right-of-way where fiber would be attached is adjacent to Washington Way or Industrial Way (the line crosses Industrial Way between structures 1/18 and 2/1). Paved areas underlie the right-of-way span between structures 2/1 and 2/2 and most of the span between structures 1/18 and 2/1. Structure 2/1 is located in a mowed grassy area adjacent to a roadway drainage ditch. Topography in the project area is flat.
