Dear Sir or Madam,

On December, 4<sup>th</sup>, 2015, in DOE/FE Order No. 3753, the U.S. Department of Energy, Office of Fossil Energy, granted to Air Flow North America, Corp ("AIR FLOW") a long-term, multi-contract authorization to export domestically sourced liquefied natural gas ("LNG") to any country located within Central America, South America or the Caribbean or Africa, which has, or in the future develops, the capacity to import LNG via ocean-going carriers (by use of approved ISO IMO7/TVAC-ASME LNG containers transported on ocean-going carriers), and with which trade is not prohibited by United States law or policy.

One of the conditions of that authorization is that AIRFLOW file semi-annual written reports (on or Before April 1 and October 1 of each year) describing its exportation activity. AIRFLOW hereby submits the semi-annual report covering the period March 31<sup>st</sup> 2019 through, October, 1st 2020.

AIRFLOW is still in negotiations with potential customers for sales of exported LNG. Exports of LNG could potentially commence depending on the outcome of the ongoing discussions.
